Choose 5 activities in a row from the eLearning menu to complete for each Inclement Weather eLearning Day.

<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Math</u></p> <p>Find 10 of the same objects. Create two different groups and write down each time (i.e., $3 + 7 = 10$, $4 + 6 = 10$) How many different groupings did you form?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Art</u></p> <p>Study yourself in the mirror and then draw a self portrait.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Reading</u></p> <p>Read a book that you have in your home and then retell the story in the correct order. What happened first, middle, and last?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Writing</u></p> <p>Tell your family a story and then illustrate that story with pictures. Remember to add words to your pictures.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Physical Activity</u></p> <p>Do 10 jumping jacks, start at the number 10 and count backwards while you do them.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Reading</u></p> <p>Find things in your house, or think of things that begin with the first letter of your name. Make a list of all the words.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Physical Activity</u></p> <p>Run in place while you count out loud to 20.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Writing</u></p> <p>Write/illustrate a story about something that happened at your house today.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Art</u></p> <p>Draw a picture of what it looks like outside today.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Math</u></p> <p>Find 100 of the same objects (rocks, beans, pennies, etc.). Put them into groups of 10 and count by 10s.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Writing</u></p> <p>Teach a family member how to do a simple task (like wash your hands) by drawing pictures for each step.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Math</u></p> <p>Find 100 of the same object (rocks, beans, pennies, etc.). Put them into groups of 5 and count by 5s.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Art</u></p> <p>Make a picture with materials that you can find outside. Ex. a person made out of leaves and sticks.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Physical Activity</u></p> <p>Put on your favorite song and have a dance party.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Reading</u></p> <p>Read a book that you have at home, and then act it out with/for your family members.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Art</u></p> <p>Choose two different shapes (square, circle, triangle, or rectangle) Using the two shapes, create a picture by tracing the shapes. Turn or slide the shapes around the paper.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Reading</u></p> <p>Make a list of the color words that you know. Create simple sentences using the color words. (Ex.. I see a red bird. I see an orange hat, etc.)</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Physical Activity</u></p> <p>Reach up to the sky as high as you can while you count to 10. Then, reach down and touch your toes while you count to 10.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Math</u></p> <p>Find 20 objects. Have your child make two sets starting with 1 and 1. Add them together and record. ($1 + 1 = 2$, next $2 + 2 = 4$, then $3 + 3 = 6$, and so on until they get to $10 + 10 = 20$.)</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Writing</u></p> <p>Teach a family member about something you know a lot about. Draw pictures and words to teach them this information. (make a book about dinosaurs)</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Physical Activity</u></p> <p>Skip around your house while listening to your favorite song.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Writing</u></p> <p>Tell your family a story and then illustrate that story with pictures. Remember to add words to your pictures.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Math</u></p> <p>Find 25 objects (pennies, beans, rocks, legos, etc.) write the numbers 1 – 9 on slips of paper and fold in half. The student will choose a number and put out that many objects. A family member will choose a number and do the same. Each person does it a second time. Count how many objects you have and decide who has more, least or the same.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Reading</u></p> <p>Using a puppet that you make from materials at your house (ex. socks), put on a puppet show for your family. This story can be made up or can come from a book that you have read.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Art</u></p> <p>Create a puppet out of materials found in your house (ex. socks).</p>
